The LEYF COVID Risk Assessment has now been revised and replaced by this new document titled - LEYF Living with COVID Guidance.

Guidance specific to education and childcare that settings should refer to after 1 April 2022 includes:

- UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) health protection in education and childcare settings
- DfE emergency planning and response

Updated UKHSA guidance from 1 April 2022 for the general population, which will also be relevant to education and childcare settings, includes:

- guidance for people with symptoms of a respiratory infection including COVID-19, or a positive test result for COVID-19
- living safely with respiratory infections, including COVID-19
- ventilation of indoor spaces to reduce the spread of COVID-19 and other respiratory infections
- COVID-19 guidance for people whose immune system means they are at higher risk

As we learn to live safely with COVID-19, there are actions we can all take to help reduce the risk of catching COVID-19 and passing it on to others. These actions will also help to reduce the spread of other respiratory infections.

Notify LEYF Compliance Manager of any positive cases of Covid in staff members. The area affected will be deep cleaned after the child or staff member has left, using normal household disinfectants. Additional use of chlorine-based cleaning detergent and 'fogging' once closed to ensure thorough deep clean and disinfection of all areas. Weekly testing will not be required. All staff are advised to follow regular LEYF Sickness and Absence Procedures. Notifications will be sent to parents regarding any positive COVID-19 cases. Bank staff are permitted to work across all LEYF nurseries with no restrictions. Reduction in child numbers will be assessed to meet legal child:staff ratios during any periods of staff shortages. DfE ratio flexibility rules for staff absences will be assessed on an individual nursery basis. Guidance for staff on wellbeing support is available Vulnerable employees have been identified and steps are in place to support them. Continue to meet statutory requirements for safeguarding and first aid. Qualified paediatric first aiders are deployed effectively First Aid and Emergency response procedures remain as per LEYF Policy.
